Preliminary study: e-Archive and e-Registration System

The problem:

- Only one fifth of government agencies have implemented some form of e-archive to ensure long-term preservation
- Duplication of effort in design and development by individual agencies is very costly. (10-15 million SEK or more).
- Report suggests similar issues and costs in municipalities



- In fact, municipalities are more complex organisations than government agencies
- Costs are likely to be even higher
- Lack of guidelines and leadership from the National Archives: "the absence of common guidelines means that the solutions developed are likely to be incompatible ".
- The National Archives currently has only advisory status over local government: appears to be seeking an extension of its mandate. (M.Kallberg, personal communication)



- In Sweden there is no designated authority responsible for coordinating registration and case management issues. It is each agency's responsibility to ensure compliance and that business needs are met.
- Lack of agreed definitions: the concepts of a record, a case, transaction, etc, are interpreted in different ways in different organisations.
- Data quality has suffered; double registrations are common



- Swedish law assumes that the authorities are independent and act independently: incentives to coordinate are weak.
- Proposal: Increase the NA's regulatory powers under the Archives Act & clarify the relationship between registration and archival description.
- Proposal: Review the National Archives' role in information management.



To introduce a system for long-term information management would not only develop features for preservation but also features for retrieval, delivery and disposal

• A common specification for SLI facilitate communication from the public to the private sector in accordance with the PSI Directive.



A change in focus!

Preservation >>>> Information Management Storage /Recall >>>>Re-Use

- "It should be easy to do it right when you archive and easy to navigate when searching and reusing information ...
- The National Archives should be assigned the task of leading a progressively structured workplan, focusing on common business support"



A change of focus!

Beyond storage:

- The National Archives should have responsibilities for business support in the State sector.
- Its role is oversight to ensure that digital information can be transferred to the National Archives as easily as possible in the long term.



Project needs

- An in-depth study of related business processes
- An in-depth study of how the presented conceptual solution will work across organizational boundaries in the public sector
- The starting point for the studies should focus on the users and information use and usability of today, tomorrow and in the future.
- Independent quality review of project implementation



Future Possible E-Services

- A common metadata repository
- A common catalogue for the definition of terms in the public sector
- Public E-Diarium. A joint diary for the public, available through Internet
- E-services for smaller authorities: easy case management and registration services
- All future e-services that use some form of records and case concepts.
