Workshop Objectives:

- 1. Discuss plans for the SSHRC midterm site visit
- 2. Discuss the work done to date by the cross-domains and focuses
- 3. Discuss the instruments and workflow employed by the cross-domains
- 4. Discuss study on the Policy Cross-domain
- 5. Establish deadlines and tasks for domains
- 6. Discuss collaboration with ISO and the National Archives of Australia
- 7. Establish dates for future meetings

Summary:

The Modeling team met to conduct and then report on a walkthrough of the GIS Case Study, as well as discuss the Manage Chain of Preservation Activity and Entity relationship models.

The International Team meeting began with a discussion of the upcoming SSHRC midterm site visit. All appropriate information concerning the visit will be disseminated to the International Team in preparation for the visit. All the research unit chairs gave reports on the work that is being carried out by their research units.

The results of the Manage Chain of Preservation Activity and Entity Relationship Models and the GIS case study walkthrough were presented and discussed.

The Description Cross-domain report included the status of the Metadata Schema Registry, the Metadata Specification Model, and the Literary Warrant Database. The discussion of the Description Cross-domain included a stated need for greater collaboration with the Policy Cross-domain and with the Modeling Cross-domain and a vote was passed to establish a formal collaboration with ISO.

The Policy Cross-domain has preliminary findings on e-government, arts and metadata, but data from the science area (focus 2) is lacking. The Legacoop Case study was introduced. There was discussion about the impact of C. Linstead's report on the Policy Cross-domain. This discussion was continued later in the workshop.

Each Focus reported on findings to date and the status of their various case studies and general studies.

The Domain 1 and 3 deliverables for the next six months and links to the rest of the research were presented and discussed. For Domain 2, J. Roeder presented his paper on authenticity, accuracy and reliability in the arts.

In terms of the Terminology Cross-domain, procedures for receiving input from research units and the structure of the terminology database was discussed.

The National Archives of Australia presented a proposal to participate in the InterPARES Project, and was accepted, by vote, as an institutional member.

Dates and venues for future InterPARES meetings were established by the group.
